General Preventive Measures with the aim of regulating participation in activities that may increase transmission of the virus, and protecting public health.

Dear All,

This is to inform you that the reference Resolution was published in the Official Gazette of October 1, 2020, whereby the President of Argentina, with the agreement of all Ministers, resolves to take the following general preventive measures, namely:

- Stay two (2) meters away from others
- Wear a mask in indoor and outdoor crowded spaces. Masks are not required outdoors when walking, jogging or biking and when a social distance of at least 2 meters is kept.
- Rooms should be adequately and constantly ventilated.
- Wash hands regularly.
- All activities must be carried out in compliance with the respective protocols, and recommendations and instructions by the public health authorities at the national and provincial levels and in the Autonomous City of Buenos Aires.
- Stay home if you are sick with COVID-19 or think you might have COVID-19 and after "close contact" with someone with "suspected or confirmed COVID-19", in accordance with the definitions provided by the national public health authority, and self-isolate as provided by Executive Order No. 260/20, as amended by Executive Order No. 167/21.

- Any economic, industrial, business, service, tourist, religious, cultural, sporting, recreational and social activities must be carried out in compliance with the respective protocol as approved by the public health authorities at the national or provincial levels or in the Autonomous City of Buenos Aires, as appropriate, based on all the recommendations and instructions by the national public health authorities.
- Employers must ensure a safe and clean workplace in accordance with the occupational safety and health standards established by the public health authorities in order to protect workers.

Stay-At-Home Mandate: only those employees who give proof that they are covered by subsection V and VI of Section 3 of Resolution No. 627/2020 by the Ministry of Health, as amended, Immunocompromised People and/or Cancer and Transplant Patients, in the terms of the aforementioned Resolution, can stay off work for a definite period of time that cannot exceed thirty (30) days and that may be renewed if they continue to have a good reason to stay home.

In such a case, employees will get a non-salary amount equal to their regular pay net of social security contributions. Employees as well as employers will continue to pay employees' and employers' contributions based on their regular taxable income for Social Health Insurance and the Institute of Social Services for Retirees and Pensioners [Instituto de Servicios Sociales para Jubilados y Pensionados]. This benefit shall not compromise Social Security funding or workers' rights under social security systems.

This Resolution shall become effective on October 1, 2021 and remain in effect until December 31, 2021, inclusive.
