Movable, Non-Movable Public Holidays and Non-Working Days in 2022

Dear All,

This Resolution contains 12 non-movable public holidays, 2 movable public holidays and 3 long weekends to promote travel, thus totaling 17 holidays in 2022.

Non-Movable Public Holidays

January 1 (New Year's Day)

February 28 and March 1 (Carnival)

March 24 (National Day of Memory for Truth and Justice)

April 2 (Day of the War Veterans and the Fallen in the Malvinas Islands)

April 15 (Good Friday)

May 1 (Labor Day)

May 25 (May Revolution Day)

June 20 (Anniversary of the death of General Manuel Belgrano)

July 9 (Independence Day)

December 8 (Immaculate Conception Day or Virgin Mary's Day)

December 25 (Christmas Day)

Movable Public Holidays

June 17 (Anniversary of the death of Martín Miguel de Güemes) is celebrated on Friday (and cannot be moved to the next Monday because it coincides with June 20)

August 17. Anniversary of the death of General José de San Martín. It is celebrated on August 15.

October 12. Day of Respect for Cultural Diversity. It is celebrated on October 10.

Revision of key concepts

Non-movable holidays

National holidays are governed by Act No. 27399 on Public Holidays and Long Weekends. They cannot be moved to another date.

Movable holidays

National holidays are governed by Act No. 27399 on Public Holidays and Long Weekends. Those movable holidays that fall on a Tuesday and Wednesday shall be moved to the preceding Monday; and those that fall on a Thursday and Friday shall be moved to the following Monday.

Non-working days

a) Act No. 26199 was passed in commemoration of Armenian Genocide. Civil servants, employees and students of Armenian origin are allowed to take April 24 off every year to attend and participate in those events to commemorate the tragedy that hit their community. All provincial governments are invited to abide by the provisions of this Act.

b) For those who profess Judaism only. Section 2 of Act No. 27399.

c) For those who profess Islam only. Section 3 of Act No. 27399

Estimated dates, governed by the lunar calendar.

d) Non-working days for tourism purposes are scheduled in accordance with Section 7 of Act No. 27399.
