Executive Order No. 1103/2026 – Public holidays due to the official visit of Pope Leo XIV to Argentina

Date: September 28, 2026

In preparation for Pope Leo XIV's official visit to Argentina scheduled for **November 8–11, 2026**, the Executive has issued **Emergency Executive Order No. 1103/2026**.

This Executive Order creates the following **national public holidays**, applicable within specific territorial jurisdictions:

- **Monday, November 9, 2026:** National Public Holiday across the entire country.
- **Tuesday, November 10, 2026:** Public Holiday exclusively in **the Province of Córdoba and in the Autonomous City of Buenos Aires**.
- **Wednesday, November 11, 2026:** Public Holiday exclusively in **the Province of Buenos Aires**.

Implications for Businesses

Companies must consider these dates when **planning business operations, payroll processing, and shifts and services** based on regional locations.

Specifically, they must identify the establishments and employees affected by each public holiday and adjust schedules and pay according to the applicable legal framework.

The EO also establishes a **Temporary Special Unit** called "**Visit of His Holiness Pope Leo XIV**," intended to handle the event's logistics, security, infrastructure, and overall organization.

The EO takes effect on **the day following its publication in the Official Gazette**.

Recommendation: Companies in the covered locations should anticipate adjusting their work schedules and ensure these workdays are correctly processed in their payroll systems for November 2026.
